From the Seneschal:

Happy New Year! I hope this finds everyone well and enjoying this most special season. I know I have very much. I have three things to talk to you about this month. They are financial policy for the Barony, Baronial awards and event planning.

First, at this months business meeting we will be discussing the new Baronial finance policy that Lady Alesia has painstakingly written for us. It is a requiemnt under Kingdom Law that we have a financial policy. We will discuss the policy and at the end of the that discussion, I will call for a vote. If the policy passes by a simple majority, will we have a straw poll, in accordance with our Baronial Charter, during the April business meeting to add the policy to it. The policy must pass by a margin of at least 60 percent to become part of our charter. If you are unable to make the meeting, you can cast your vote by written proxy. If you have question on this, feel free to contact me.

Second, I would like to thank our awards committee for all of their hard work in developing all the different options for the Barony. We will be taking up this matter at the Feburary business meeting. The process will be the same as for financial policy above. For we are again, attempting to modify our Charter.

Lastly, I would like to put out a few polices for event planning. In the future, all baronial event announcements should be in the Acorn no later than 90 days before the event is to be held. This is to ensure that the word can get out to the populace in time for them to make plans to attend. Also, I will require all Autocrats to attend every business meeting 6 months prior to the event in order to brief the Barony on the event and where how the populace of the Barony can assist. If the Autocrat can not make the meeting due to mundane matters, then his/her

deputy can brief or he/she can give me the update I will brief at the meeting. I think that these policies are important to ensure that everyone is keep informed on upcoming events and the planning behind them.

I thank you for your time and again for the honor of being your seneschal. This is by far the best job in the Kingdom.

Following a dinner break (dinner not provided but there are many local off-site dining establishments to fit any budget), we will re-open the site for our traditional Yule Revel.

The evening will be filled with Deserts, Dancing, and perhaps we'll even have a visit from Father Christmas himself.

A&S Competitions: Toys & Kids Stuff: Gentles are asked to enter items that medieval children used or played with. Please be aware that judges are likely to "test" the entries, and therefore fragile/delicate entries are not encouraged. Our young judges will award one to three points in the following categories: a) Is it pretty/nice, b) is it fun, and c) would you want one. Judges will also award an extra point to their favorite entry. The entry sheets will have a line for what the object is, who used it, and when it was used. You are welcome to provide additional documentation for curious adults, but it is not necessary. If you are entering a game or similar item, please provide instructions for play. Anyone under the age of 14 is asked to help us judge the competition. Anyone wishing to judge need only ask at troll, and they will be pointed towards a competition organizer. Judges need to bring a literate parent or guardian to help fill out the judging sheets. Judges may need to test out the entries to make sure they work, but parents are still expected to be responsible for their children.

From the Capital Beltway: Take I-66 West towards Vienna/Front Royal. Follow approximately 6.6 miles. Exit onto LEE JACKSON MEMORIAL HWY/US-50, West, towards Fair Oaks/Winchester. After about 2.5 miles, pass under the Fairfax County Parkway (Route 7100), and be in the left lane to turn left at the next light onto Middle Ridge Drive. IMMEDIATELY turn left onto the Route 50 service road. This road curves right, becoming Kings Way. The church is on the left.

From points west or southern Fairfax County: Take your best route to the intersection of I-66 and Route 7100, Fairfax County Parkway. Take the Parkway NORTH. (DON'T exit at 50: You won't be able to get across the traffic to where you need to be.) After crossing Route 50, turn left at the light onto Rugby Road. Go straight through the intersection of Rugby and Route 50, and IMMEDIATELY turn left onto the Route 50 service road. This road curves right, becoming Kings Way. The church is on the left.

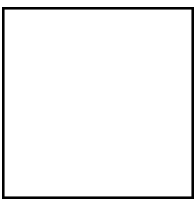
