The list can go on for ages - only limited by the speed at which our hands can write out what our minds can think of.


Come, share with us adventures in the great Barony of Ponte Alto, in the grand Kingdom of Atlantia, in this - the current Middle Ages!

How Long Did That Take?

Introducing the "How Long Did That Take?" Experiment

Instigator/Sponsor: Lady Amie Sparrow

Anybody who does any kinds of arts or craft is inevitably asked the question, "So how long did that take you?" Some of us have a rough idea of the hours involved. Some do not.

The answer to the question would be very helpful for people starting out in a new craft or experienced people who want to create something they've already made but can't remember the time it took. I would love to have some kind of chart that gives the hours generally required for certain projects. How long does it take for an experienced person to create a scroll? How long does it take a mid-level person? How long for a beginner? What about a leather quiver? A woven belt? A metal helmet?

To find those answers, I'm going to run an A&S experiment that takes a year, the purpose of which will enable you to answer the question, "So how long did that take you?" I want to include all skill levels in this endeavor.

The end result would be a display of projects with associated hours. At this time, the goal for the display is Pennsic 2018.

What's the point of the experiment? For me, personally, it would be a great metric to prevent me from embarking on a project that I don't have time to complete. (Didn't I make that peasant dress in a weekend? Um, no. According to your OWN NOTES it took you all your free time for two weeks!) For new folks, it will give them a thumbnail estimate of how long their projects might take so they can set their expectations accordingly and not be discouraged.

What I would want from participants is 1) a photo of their finished project and 2) the information below.

As much as I enjoy a cold beer – or a cold cider, or even mead! – on a hot summer day, sometimes it's refreshing to have something non-alcoholic. Especially useful for those darn dry sites!

Our resident Mongol (and Baronial food/poison-taster), Lord Naran, offered up this recipe for Sekanjabin to share with his fellow Pontoons.

Try this at Pennsic! It's very tasty! -editor

SEKANJABIN RECIPE

STRAWBERRY AND MINT

Note: "The recipe I found said chop the strawberries, and remove when finished with a fine sieve, but I decided to puree them and leave them in."

Recipe:

Ingredients: Water, white sugar, balsamic vinegar, 12 ounces strawberries, fresh mint.

Boil 2 cups water.

Add 4 cups white sugar, and dissolve over high heat.

Then add 1 cup balsamic vinegar and stir.

Add 12 ounces of strawberries, pureed, and a cup of chopped fresh mint.

Simmer for 30 minutes.

Turn off the heat, let sit/cool overnight, then strain out the mint.

Bottle (clean 2 liter soda bottle is fine).

When wanting to serve, add 4-6 part cold water, ice if desired.

Note: "The original recipe indicated to add the fruit first, and the vinegar last, but if you don't simmer the vinegar, much of the acid taste remains. Simmering removes much of the acetic acid."
