# Making a Heraldic Chair Cover by Lady Mariana


I have a camp chair that I like to bring to events. It's very comfortable, easy to pack, and easy to carry, making it ideal for someone who generally doesn't have much transportation space to events. However, it very much breaks the 10-foot rule, being obtrusively modern and I've wanted to change that for quite some time. As part of the <u>Drachenwald Laurel's Challenge</u>, I decided it was high time I did something about it.

The easiest way to go about this, I decided, was to do so by draping. The chair is not a perfect square footprint, and with draping, I could take into account the weirder shapes of the arms. My priorities for the cover were as follows:

- Something that I wouldn't worry too much about when it inevitably gets dirty
- Something that I could easily repair or cover damage on
- Something light that won't be hard to roll or fold during packing.

Taking all of that into account, I chose to use heavy-weight linen in light gray for the main body of the cover. Because my heraldry has some smaller detailing, I ultimately chose to add my device as an applique on the back. This is still in progress but is being done in layers of felt, accented where necessary with embroidery to provide detail.

**Step 1**: Measure the width of the chair back. For me, this was roughly 25" wide. Make sure to account for seam allowance!



**Step 2**: Measure from the floor at the back, over the top, following the seat down, and ending at the floor in front of the seat.

This will be the length of your main body piece. Cut a body piece to these specifications

**Step 3**: Drape the body piece over the chair. Pin down the sides of the back until you reach the arms (Point A on the diagram).

• Arm method 1: Drape the whole arm.

Drape the arms. Start this by pinning the fabric down the length of the seat on the sides. Then drape the fabric over the arm. Make a mark to denote floor length. Pin the back of the main piece to the side of the draped arm piece. Pin the top of the arm drape to the main body piece. This can get a little wonky shaped, so make sure you've left yourself some room to work.





• Arm method 2: Drape in pieces.

First, measure the length and width of the top of the arm. Add 2-3" on to the length. Cut a piece to these measurements. Pin this piece to the main body piece where the arm meets the frame of the back.




Then measure the rectangle made on the outside of the arm. Cut a piece to these measurements, including a seam allowance. Pin this rectangle first to the top of the arm piece, then to the back of the main body piece.

Next, measure the rectangle made on the inside of the arm, between the arm and the seat. Cut a piece to these measurements and pin, first to the top of the arm, then to the body piece starting with the chair back, and working down the length of the seat.



**Step 5**: Adjust the pins and pieces in place until you have a well-fitted chair cover. I chose to make sure mine was snug, but not so tight that I couldn't get it on and off.

Because the seams are so all over the place, I sewed them together by hand. This gave me the flexibility to adjust as I was going. I highly recommend NOT trimming any excess fabric until you're sewing, to allow for those adjustments. Once the seams are in place, trim the bottom down and hem. I chose to just use pinking scissors on my seams for starters. I expect to need to go back and reinforce these with fabric tape at some point.




I then cut out my applique. My heraldry has a few elements -- the base (green), the bordure (gold), the rose (white), and the ermine spots (black). I decided to approach these elements with layers of felt for ease of arrangement and longevity. I started with cutting out the base and bordure and will be using those to determine the size of the rose and ermine spots. The felt I got is only 18 inches wide, so I used that as the limiting factor on the size. The base is roughly 18x24 inches. I used the green layer as a template for the gold, sketched out the curves of the bordure, then cut out the inner part. I am currently in the process of attaching the gold layer to the green.

This is as far as I've currently gotten on this and I'm hoping to finish it in October. The next steps are to properly size the rose and ermine spots. The rose is going to need some embroidery. Without any added details on the petals and the seeds, it doesn't really look much like a rose. I'll do those with some of my blackwork supplies.


